Dr. George W. Murray Keynote Speaker

George Murray is a missionary at heart. Following his leadership and experience in the field of missions, he assumed the leadership of Columbia International University (CIU) in Columbia, South Carolina, first as CIU's President (2000 - 2007), and then as CIU's Chancellor (2007-2017). Columbia International University specializes in training people for Great Commission service around the world. George has traveled and ministered all across the United States of America and in 83 other countries. He has been happily married to Annette since 1969, and their four children (all married) have blessed them with nine grandchildren (8 boys and 1 girl). George is a graduate of CIU (B.A., 1967; M.A., 1981) and Trinity International University (D.Miss, 1995). Annette is a graduate of CIU (B.A., 1969) and Biblical Theological Seminary (M.A. in Theology/ Counseling, 1995). George loves good music (all genres), reading, hiking, fishing, and playing tennis.



Tim and Sarah Tinkel Children's Program Speaker

How Shall They Hear? In Every Nation, Tribe, and People

Pastor Peter Ng

A Chinese church was interviewing a candidate as their potential pastor. The candidate generally agreed with the church's mission and vision. However, he considered the church's multi-ethnic ministry is just a slogan but unrealistic. His reason is that for the Chinese church to spend so much time evangelizing non-Chinese people across language and racial barriers, it will be fruitless. He believed it would be more effective to focus on preaching the gospel to the Chinese. This is not an isolated incident. Many first-generation Chinese immigrant church leaders have a similar mentality. We would ask: Is this God' s desire for the Chinese church?

We understand that Chinese immigrants have always

lived in a mono-cultural society, which affect their ability in learning foreign languages or cultures. Although most Chinese in North America can speak English, they usually are cautious when mingling with other ethnic people, and are not easily immersed in the multicultural society of North America. Not to mention taking the initiative to do crosscultural evangelism to be a blessing to all nations. But as followers of Christ, should we break through?

According to the Bible, missions is the lifeblood of the church. If the church does not preach the gospel to all nations and all peoples, she will miss the Great Commission. From Genesis to Revelation, we can see that God's intention is for "every nation, tribe, and people" to receive salvation. Let us consider a few scriptures.

Beginning in Genesis, God has entrusted all nations to Abraham, our father of faith. His blessings from above must be connected to all nations. The LORD said to Abram,

"Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you. "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you." (Genesis 12:1-3)

When God blessed Abraham, he also required him to be a blessing to "all nations."

Psalm 67 emphasizes that the reason why we seek God's blessings is not just for our own people, but for the "earth", "all nations", "all the peoples" to receive heavenly blessings and worship God together. "May God be gracious to us and bless us and make his face shine on us, so that your ways may be known on earth, your salvation among all nations. May the peoples praise you, God; may all the peoples praise you." (Psalm 67:1-3)

Before the Lord Jesus ascended to heaven, he said to his disciples: "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creation." (Mark 16:15). This means the mission of the church is to "all people", not just "Chinese people".

When the Lord returns, Chinese believers will worship with all nations, tribes, and peoples. 'After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb." ' (Revelation 7:9-10) If this is our heart's desire, today how should we share the gospel with "every nation, tribe, and people"?

I have twice led short-term mission teams to Ecuador in South America to experience the mission field first-hand.

I think of the five young American missionaries who went to preach the gospel to the uncivilized Auca tribe in 1956, but were stabbed to death by cannibals with spears in the forest. They sacrificed their lives for the Lord! However, their family did not give up on missions. A year later, the five young widows of the missionaries returned to the forests of the Auca tribe to preach the gospel to them. When the news reporter asked them: "These people killed your husbands, how can you come to help them again?" They said: "Jesus Christ died for 'all mankind', and everyone needs the salvation. The death of our husbands makes us feel that these people need God's salvation even more." Another said, "When we see that our husband's blood has become the foundation of the Auca church, our joy cannot be greater than this!" What is our greatest joy? If we don't engage in cross-cultural missions, how shall they hear?

Washington DC Short Term Mission

My family had the privilege of serving together in Cobb Island, Maryland as part of the Cornerstone STM Team. When Pastor Jeff announced that the STM mission trip was open to families, I was so excited. My husband and I both agreed this would be a great opportunity for our entire family – my two daughters, Frank, and myself - to serve together. Raising kids in a privileged suburban area in New Jersey with values that put personal achievement and material possessions as paramount is very challenging. There are few opportunities for them to see the priorities that we value as Christians demonstrated in their environment. I knew the mission trip would be a great experience to serve others through doing yard work, cleaning, and any other tasks needed. I wanted them to experience what Jesus modeled when he came not to be served, but to serve and ultimately sacrifice His perfect life on our behalf.

After we registered for the mission trip, Pastor Jeff, Daniel and Josiah had several team-building meetings planned for us to learn to work together and get to know one another. I was impressed with the effort the leaders put into coming up with engaging team-building activities. The team also had a memorable opportunity to wash one another's feet as Jesus modeled with his disciples. These experiences of working together and serving one another were exactly what I was hoping my kids would be exposed to, which contrasts to the immense pressure to race to the top of the academic social status ladder they usually encounter. Since the world is constantly telling our kids they have to achieve to have value, I was grateful that the kids got to experience an environment characterized by God's grace, love and heart to serve others. I also appreciated Pastor Jeff's encouragement to the team that if someone asks them to help in any way, the answer should be "Sure!". To be able to cultivate this atmosphere of cheerful servanthood especially among a group of teenagers was truly evidence of God's grace at work.

When the team arrived at Cobb Island, the unity that God started during the team-building meetings continued throughout the trip. The team had a huge age range, yet everyone served together as members of the same body working to shine Jesus' light. For example, the first day, I was assigned to clean the storage room at the Cobb Island Baptist Church with one other adult, two high school girls and my middle school-aged daughter. I was impressed by the hard work and determination the girls had to vigorously clean rusty shelves, sweep grungy floors, vacuum mouse droppings and dispose of snake skins and dead mice. To have my daughter see these older teenage girls sacrificing their time and energy to get down and dirty to help serve the church was priceless.

Coming back to NJ, I am so appreciative for the opportunity we had to attend the mission trip. I look forward to continue building an atmosphere of Christ's love and cheerful servanthood in our church, home and community. I have seen spiritual growth in our entire family and have had better faith conversations with my kids after the mission trip. Every night during the trip, our team would share their "God moment" or where they saw God at work that day. After the trip, I have continued to try to ask my kids what their "God moment" was that day before bed and we have had much deeper conversations than before. This encourages me that God is actively working as we try to point our kids to Christ. I know that God has used the mission trip to sow seeds of faith in my family and the entire STM team and I am excited to see the mountains that God will move as we put that faith into action in our local church and community in New Jersey.

Washington DC Cobb Island Short Term Mission Trip

Coming on this mission trip, I knew that I shouldn't have any expectations but I still came with one expectation to not lead the VBS songs during VBS. Of course, I ended up leading the VBS songs with Sarah and Katie and I actually enjoyed the experience. I' m so glad that God answered my initial prayer before the mission trip to: "be flexible and trust his discernment for how we might best serve" . I was blessed to serve with Sarah and Katie and observe how they each shine when they are leading worship: Katie picked up the dance movements quickly and precisely demonstrated each movement when we were teaching the dance and Sarah brought the energy to encourage even the shyest kid to sing and dance along. It was also great to have the perspective from the front of the room and see all of the volunteers from Cornerstone and Cobb Island Baptist Church singing and dancing with the kids at VBS.

After leaving Cobb Island, I' m encouraged to continue growing in my faith and serving God in unexpected and meaningful ways.

Born in Taiwan and raised on four continents, Mary has lived in Swaziland, Taiwan, Indonesia, New Zealand, Philippines, Hong Kong, and the U.S., and traveled extensively. She received her Doctor of Strategic Leadership from Regent University, VA in 2017. She is married to John and has two boys. John was born in Tainan and grew up in four countries – Taiwan, Thailand, Laos, and the U.S. He graduated from UC Berkeley, and is a licensed architect with his own consulting practice. He has lived and worked in New York, Chicago, San Francisco, Taipei, Hong Kong, and Kansas City. John is a third-generation believer, whose grandparents were saved through missionaries with the China Inland Mission, who went deep into China where others did not go.



Derek Kin Man Leung & Sindy Wai Sheung Chow (Ecuador, South America, Taiwan)

Their role is to assist the church in developing a Mandarin ministry and to work with Chinesespeaking university students. Their service includes spiritual counseling, leading Bible studies, preaching, discipleship and training, as well as leading people to faith and providing pastoral care.

Vivian Mah (UK)



Vivian grew up with Cornerstone as a child and was dedicated to full-time ministry while at Cornerstone.

After seminary, she began serving

British-born Chinese (BBC) youth with Chinese Overseas Christian Mission (COCM) in the UK. Her ministries include serving in her local church, Crossway (a joint English Service of two local Chinese churches in Milton Keynes), planning the annual PHAT Camp for BBC youth, and growing the youth ministry in the UK.



Mark and Rachel Kim (Japan)

Mark and Rachel serve in Christ Bible Institute (CBI), which focuses on equipping Christians in Japan for gospel ministry, including

leadership development, church support, resource translation, and counseling.

C&C family (Taiwan)

C and C have been serving in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia for over 10 years. Their vision is to plant churches, and raise up leaders and faithful disciples of Christ through sharing the good news to high school and university students, Bible studies, small groups, and one-on-one discipleship. Their long-term vision is for Mongolian believers to be equipped to reproduce spiritual generations and continue the process of sharing the gospel and planting and leading churches (2 Timothy 2:2). Currently they have established a local church consisting of mostly university students and young professionals. They have two children 6 and 2, L and D, both of whom were born in Mongolia. The family is currently serving alongside a Navigator campus ministry team in Taoyuan, Taiwan and will be there for at least until the next year.



Nathan Liu (US)

Nathan Liu is serving with Cru (formerly Campus Crusade for Christ) in New Jersey. His team serves

on 20+ campuses across the state, but Nathan is active at Rutgers University, Monmouth University, and Ocean County Community College. He also teaches training courses for new staff and missionaries heading to every corner of the globe.



Pastor John Yeh and Shuting (Taiwan)

Pastor John Yeh and his wife, sister Shuting, after serving in

CCCS for seven years, have been called by God to return to Taiwan for missionary work. Together with the missionary team of Tamkang Church, they will preach the message of God's salvation, lead people to faith, and rescue souls in the spiritually challenging land of Taiwan. The vision of Tamkang Church is to establish 20 congregations in Taiwan within 10 years, leading people to faith in Christ and becoming His disciples. The two will spend time working and serving with the Tamkang team, and afterward, as needed, they may be sent to unreached areas for missionary work, hoping that through God's grace, those who have not yet heard the gospel will have the opportunity to receive it. May we encourage one another in God's kingdom, "seize the opportunity—now is the time" to spread the gospel!



Rev. Calvin & Kathy Lee (Japan)

Rev. Lee and Kathy were Cornerstone's home-

grown missionaries. They were IT professionals, before responding to God's calling. Rev. Lee completed his seminary training at the Westminster Theological Seminary. He first served as a missionary in South Africa for a few years. Since 2004, they have been serving the mission field in Japan and have established five churches around the Tokyo metro area. God has opened new opportunities in Japan including a new wave of Chinese immigrants, Chinese and Japanese mixed families, and secondgeneration Chinese-Japanese. The current mission vision will be focused on:

1. Outreaching to a new area at Yokohama in Kanagawa Prefecture

2. Partnering with a Japanese Reformed Seminary to offer reformed theological training courses and

3. Establishing a Christian Faith Society in Japan to gather all Christians in Japan creating a lifestyle of "Christian Faith" inside and outside the church and throughout Japan.

Il Corinthians 8:2-3, Il Corinthians 9:6-15 How do I make a Faith Promise?

Pray and seek God's will: God is pleased with us to seek him and is willing to reveal His will to us. Prayerfully consider the amount you can faithfully purpose to give.

Make your promise: Decide on an amount to give in response to God's guidance.

Trusting God's provision: Explore various approaches to be able to give the promised amount, and ask God to for His provision to meet your commitment.

Harvest spiritual fruit: Experience growth of faith as you experience God's provision and blessing in giving sacriPcially.

How will I be able to fulfill my Faith Promise?

- God may increase your income or give you an unexpected bonus.

- Decrease your expenses: do not buy what you want; buy only what you need.

- Live a simpler life, re-prioritize vacation expenses and other planned large expenditures, etc.
